"As a child, I was a part of the newcomer population that relied heavily on social services. I came to Canada from Denmark as a toddler. My mother was a refugee from Uganda escaping Idi Amin and my father immigrated from Pakistan. Although my parents worked multiple jobs and had Ismaili Muslim community support, it was a difficult life.

We moved around often and lived in subsidized housing. I spent hours in before and after school care and enrolled in programs at various community centres. My favourite Christmas gift as a child was from an agency's toy bank...a doll with a suitcase of hand-knitted clothes that a donor had taken the time to make for a disadvantaged child...for me.

I choose to devote my time as a board volunteer at St. Stephen's because it is an organization that is close to my heart and I have
